Boston African American Heritage Tour

Boston is home to numerous attractions of great significance to African American heritage.

The first African slaves arrived in Boston in 1638, eight years after the city was founded. The American Revolution was a turning point in African American History. At the end of the war, there were more free black men than slaves.

This led to a dynamic effort in early African American History to create independent African American Institutions and pave the way toward ending slavery in the rest of the nation.

You will explore the "Black Heritage Trail", a 1.6 mile tour encompassing the largest collection of sites related to a free African American community prior to the Civil War.

Some of the most popular sites include the African Meeting House, Abiel Smith School and Robert Gould Shaw Memorial.

Visit the Museum of African American History which chronicles the remarkable story of how free African Americans and white abolitionists together changed a nation.
